Agenda Item No. 1: Citizen Comments.

Emergency Addition to Agenda to Address Avian Flu Threat to Dairy Industry.

Agenda Item No. 7: Safety Protocol in Treating Dairy Industry to Prevent Spread of Avian Flu. Tony Nunes advised that there exists a present emergency item to be addressed by the District relating to the Avian Flu impacting the dairy industry. The board finds that the present outbreak of Avian Flu within the Tulare County and throughout the State poses a significant and emergency situation that the District needs to address to ensure that the Avian Flu is not being spread by District employees when traveling from dairy to dairy. Tony recommends that the District adopt and implement best practices to ensure that District employees are disinfecting taking precautions in not spreading the Avian Flu from dairy-to-dairy in its District activity in the District. Upon a motion duly made by Tony Nunes, and seconded by Craig Smith, and unanimously carried, the board authorized the general manager to implement best practices to reduce the risk of the spread of the Avian Flu between dairies by District employees that are traveling and between dairies.

Assembly Bill No. 1637

CHAPTER 586

An act to add Section 50034 to the Government Code, relating to local government.

[Approved by Governor October 08, 2023. Filed with Secretary of State October 08, 2023.]

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

AB 1637, Irwin. Local government: internet websites and email addresses.

(1) The California Constitution authorizes cities and counties to make and enforce within their limits all local, police, sanitary, and other ordinances and regulations not in conflict with general laws and further authorizes cities organized under a charter to make and enforce all ordinances and regulations in respect to municipal affairs, which supersede inconsistent general laws.

The California Public Records Act requires a local agency to make public records available for inspection and allows a local agency to comply by posting the record on its internet website and directing a member of the public to the internet website, as specified.

This bill, no later than January 1, 2029, would require a local agency, as defined, that maintains an internet website for use by the public to ensure that the internet website utilizes a ".gov" top-level domain or a ".ca.gov" second-level domain and would require a local agency that maintains an internet website that is noncompliant with that requirement to redirect that internet website to a domain name that does utilize a ".gov" or ".ca.gov" domain. This bill, no later than January 1, 2029, would also require a local agency that maintains public email addresses to ensure that each email address provided to its employees utilizes a ".gov" domain name or a ".ca.gov" domain name. By adding to the duties of local officials, the bill would impose a state-mandated local program.

- (2) The bill would include findings that changes proposed by this bill address a matter of statewide concern rather than a municipal affair and, therefore, apply to all cities, including charter cities.
- (3) The California Constitution requires the state to reimburse local agencies and school districts for certain costs mandated by the state. Statutory provisions establish procedures for making that reimbursement.

This bill would provide that, if the Commission on State Mandates determines that the bill contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement for those costs shall be made pursuant to the statutory provisions noted above.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Legislature finds and declares all of the following:

- (a) The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), within the Department of Homeland Security, sponsors the ".gov" top-level domain and makes it available solely to United States-based government organizations and publicly controlled entities, including California's local agencies.
- (b) California's local agencies qualify for a ".gov" domain without paying any fee.
- (c) Using ".gov" increases security by enforcing multifactor authentication on all accounts in the ".gov" registrar, requiring browsers to only use a Hypertext Transfer Protocol Secure (HTTPS) connection with ".gov" domains, and enabling the addition of a security contact, making it easier for the public to alert the agency about potential security issues with the agency's online services.
- (d) The Government Operations Agency oversees the ".ca.gov" domain name program, and the Department of Technology manages the registration, change, and renewal process for ".ca.gov" domains. Agencies are not required to pay any fee for a ".ca.gov" domain.
- (e) To administer the ".ca.gov" second-level domain, the Department of Technology has established policies and protocols consistent with federal policy, including, but not limited to, the federal Interagency Committee on Government Information's Recommended Policies and Guidelines for Federal Public Websites and the federal .gov Registrar administered by CISA.
- (f) Users of websites or other internet services with a ".ca.gov" domain can be assured they are accessing an official California governmental resource.
- SEC. 2. Section 50034 is added to the Government Code, to read:
- **50034.** (a) (1) No later than January 1, 2029, a local agency that maintains an internet website for use by the public shall ensure that the internet website utilizes a ".gov" top-level domain or a ".ca.gov" second-level domain.
 - (2) If a local agency that is subject to paragraph (1) maintains an internet website for use by the public that is noncompliant with paragraph (1) by January 1, 2029, that local agency shall redirect that internet website to a domain name that does comply with paragraph (1).
- (b) No later than January 1, 2029, a local agency that maintains public email addresses for its employees shall ensure that each email address provided to its employees utilizes a ".gov" domain name or a ".ca.gov" domain name.
- (c) For purposes of this section, "local agency" means a city, county, or city and county.
- **SEC. 3.** The Legislature finds and declares that Section 2 of this act adding Section 50034 to the Government Code addresses a matter of statewide concern and is not a municipal affair as that term is used in Section 5 of Article XI of the California Constitution. Therefore, Section 1 of this act adding Section 50034 to the Government Code applies to all cities, including charter cities.
- **SEC. 4.** If the Commission on State Mandates determines that this act contains costs mandated by the state, reimbursement to local agencies and school districts for those costs shall be made pursuant to Part 7 (commencing with Section 17500) of Division 4 of Title 2 of the Government Code.

One particular success was AB 1637 (Irwin), which would require local governments to migrate websites and email addresses to domains ending in ".gov" or ".ca.gov." CSDA and its coalition partners have been working hard advocating an Oppose Unless Amended position on the bill. Special districts' cost concerns were prominently highlighted in the Assembly Appropriations Committee analysis of the bill. Special districts are now excluded from the bill's requirements due to amendments taken to the bill when it passed off the Suspense File.

 AB 1637 (Irwin) Local government: Internet websites and email addresses. Amended to limit the scope of the bill to cities to counties, thereby excluding special districts from the bill's requirements to migrate local government websites and email addresses to .gov or .ca.gov domains, and to extend deadlines.

Humans

West Nile virus

A total of 11 new human cases of West Nile virus (WNV) disease were reported this week from 8 counties: Fresno (1), Los Angeles (4), Sacramento (1), San Bernardino (1), San Diego (1), San Joaquin (1), Stanislaus (1), and Yolo (1). **This is the first human case of WNV disease for San Diego County this year.** In 2024, 74 human cases of WNV disease were reported from 21 counties. Of the 74 cases, 55 (74%) had neuroinvasive disease and 7 (9.5%) were fatal. The median age of the case-patients was 59 years and 46 (62%) of the case-patients were male. The dates of symptom onset ranged from May 28 to September 5. In addition to the 74 cases of WNV disease, 12 asymptomatic WNV-positive blood donors have been reported from 6 counties: Butte (1), Fresno (3), Los Angeles (3), San Bernardino (2), Santa Clara (2), and Stanislaus (1). At this time last year, 205 human cases of WNV disease had been reported from 28 counties.

St. Louis encephalitis virus

No human cases of St. Louis encephalitis virus (SLEV) disease have been reported. At this time last year, 3 human cases of SLEV disease had been reported from 2 counties.

Dead Birds

A total of 14 new WNV positive dead birds were reported from 7 counties: Alameda (2), Fresno (1), Lake (1), Los Angeles (3), Sacramento (3), Santa Clara (3), and Yolo (1). **This is the first WNV positive dead bird reported from Fresno County this year.** In 2024, 488 WNV positive dead birds have been reported from 21 counties. At this time last year, 743 WNV positive dead birds had been reported from 30 counties.

Mosquito Pools

West Nile virus

A total of 69 new WNV positive mosquito pools were reported from 7 counties: Fresno (7), Los Angeles (20), Merced (2), San Joaquin (8), Stanislaus (6), Tulare (25), and Yolo (1). In 2024, 1,904 WNV positive mosquito pools have been reported from 25 counties. At this time last year, 4,223 WNV positive mosquito pools had been reported from 31 counties.

St. Louis encephalitis virus

A total of 2 new SLEV positive mosquito pools were reported from 1 county: Tulare (2). In 2024, 28 SLEV positive mosquito pools have been reported from 5 counties: Fresno (13), Imperial (1), Kings (3), Madera (4), and Tulare (7). At this time last year, 639 SLEV positive mosquito pools had been reported from 15 counties.

Sentinel Chickens

A total of 10 new WNV positive chickens were reported this week from 6 counties: Alameda (1), Butte (1), Lake (2), Los Angeles (4), Sutter (1), and Tehama (1). **This is the first WNV positive sentinel chicken reported from Alameda County this year.** In 2024, 149 WNV positive sentinel chickens have been reported from 16 counties. At this time last year, 167 WNV positive chickens had been reported from 17 counties.

TEST PROTOCOLS

Humans:

Specimens are tested by local laboratories with an IgM or IgG immunofluorescent assay (IFA) and/or an IgM enzyme immunoassay (EIA). Specimens with inconclusive results are forwarded to the California Department of Public Health Viral and Rickettsial Disease Laboratory (VRDL) for further testing with a plaque reduction neutralization test (PRNT).

Dead Birds

Oral swab samples collected from bird carcasses are tested at the UC Davis Arbovirus Research and Training laboratory (DART) or at a local agency for West Nile virus by RT-qPCR.

Sentinel Chickens:

Dried blood spot samples from sentinel chickens are tested at the California Department of Public Health Vector-Borne Disease Laboratory for IgG antibodies to West Nile, St. Louis encephalitis, and western equine encephalomyelitis viruses by an EIA. Positive samples are confirmed by IFA, western-blot, or PRNT.

Mosquito Pools:

Mosquito pools are tested at DART or at a local agency for West Nile, western equine encephalomyelitis, and St. Louis encephalitis viral RNA using a multiplex RT-qPCR. Invasive *Aedes* mosquitoes (*Ae. aegypti* and *Ae. albopictus*) are also tested at DART for chikungunya, dengue, and Zika viral RNA by a separate RT-qPCR.
